My internship report

In the laboratory

Every day from 9 am to 4 pm, I was at the "Industripark Höchst" where I had my internship. The "Industriepark" is an association of more than 90 companies, which is centrally located in the middle of Europe. My internship was at "Euticals", a company of the "Albany Molecular Research Inc." short "AMRI".

"Euticals" is a pharmaceutical and fine chemical company, which means they produce molecules and molecular-bindings for other pharmaceutical companies like "Bayer" or "Sanofi". They are also popular for reagents, which are used in many chemical sections.

Such a process is very difficult and quite protracted, as I could learn in the 3 weeks there. From the idea to the final products... This takes a long time and much effort.

And what could I do? I did many things. A typical day was like this:

When I started my day, I always had to change my clothes, because of the chemicals, which are produced there and which I had to work with. I learned how to handle all the physiochemical analysis-machines and all the material which is used in a laboratory. I had to be quite careful, because of all the fragile glass and the dangerous materials. One day, me and my adviser cleaned the whole laboratory. That sounds a bit annoying, but it was a good time to learn where all the things were.

It's a pity, that I'm not 16, because when you are 16, you can do much more in a laboratory, than I was allowed to, but nevertheless, it was a very interesting and good experience and I had a lot of fun there.
